Apprentice responsibilities:

During these months, you will learn and be asked to take on a variety of tasks, expect the work to be physically and mentally demanding and the conditions to vary. Areas we will cover and you will become responsible for will include:

- care of livestock (collecting eggs, daily tasks associated with chickens etc.)
- cultivation
- daily chores (livestock, records etc.)
- harvesting
- irrigation
- marketing: either our box program, our farmer's market, or our restaurants sales
- overseeing all aspects of 1-3 field crops
- overseeing all aspects of 1-2 greenhouses
- preparation of a value added product: (dried, frozen, canned fruit or vegetables, teas, etc.)
- propagation: seeding/planting/transplanting/cuttings
- recordkeeping
- seed saving
- weed management

•	Our schedule is 40 hours per week on production-oriented projects. You will be asked to participate 5-6 days weekly with hours per day varying depending on season, weather, harvest urgency etc. The work day will usually begin around am. Your hours include a 15-20 minute coffee break each day; lunch is usually an hour and is separate from the work day hours (non-paid).
•	We do a Farmers' Market/CSA deliver every You will be scheduled in to
	market/deliver rotation every week, these will be counted towards your hours.
•	Once a week we meet as a group (apprentices and staff) to review previous week's activities, plan for the week ahead and share feedback. We encourage your full participation in these meetings and know you'll have lots of questions in the beginning and also that it's a very important time for you to listen and observe the systems we have.
•	Through the week you will spend much of your time working alongside us, particularly in the beginning, when the work/learning balance is shifted towards learning as we train you there will also be plenty of times you'll be asked to work alone. Once trained, be made responsible for an area of the farm/crop/etc. that will require approximately hours of work each week. Most of those hours

- you'll eventually do by yourself. Questions are always encouraged.
 You are expected to take care of your own breakfasts and your dinners
- Weekdays we share lunch together. You will be asked to help out in various ways --either in meal prep or cleaning up afterwards. Having lunch together is a great daily opportunity to share updates, planning, dialogue and connect together.
